

Starting point



Citrus fruit farming is going through an **economic, social and environmental sustainability crisis**. Citrus fruit identification is the main basis for varietal management and planning and one of the most pressing problems in the citrus fruit industry.

The **GOCITRUS Task Force** is advocating a varietal authentication system and associating it with the development of a decision support tool for appropriate varietal choice.




Objectives



Reorganise and define the **varietal foundations** on which to build the citrus fruit revolution that our production and export sectors have embarked on to meet the challenges and requirements of the new market relationships.

- Setting up an identification system using the Citruseq genome database.
- Creating an app to assist producers in their varietal choice based on their specific crop conditions.



Impacts



Eliminating mistakes in plant material procurement.

Enhancing producer competitiveness and traceability through certification at each point in the value chain.

Supporting varietal diversification and farm restructuring and upgrading.



Impacts



Promoting more efficient and responsible resource use.

Reducing current plot abandonment and enhancing landscape preservation with producer farms operating at full capacity.

Helping to **lessen erosion and improve soil conservation** and biodiversity.

Partnering to **deliver innovation** which resolves a problem or seizes an opportunity using a joint, multi-sector action approach.
